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Key Communications with Districts

With the start of the new school year, please verify that the contact information in the <u>MDE-ORG system</u> is up to date and accurate. If your district has a new District Assessment Coordinator (DAC), please ensure MDE-ORG is updated as soon as possible so they can receive relevant information, including opportunities specifically designed for new DACs.

All contact information in MDE-ORG is updated and maintained by the district's Site Verification Coordinator (SVC), who is listed in MDE-ORG. The SVC maintains the district's contact information within the <u>District and</u> <u>School Site Verification system</u>. Work with the SVC for any necessary changes or updates.

Assessment Update Distribution

MDE sends the weekly *Assessment Update* to all DACs and District Technology Coordinators (DTCs) indicated in MDE-ORG. If there is more than one DAC, they all will be included on the *Assessment Update* distribution list. Additional DACs may be designated as an Alternate DAC in MDE-ORG. Any additional staff interested in receiving the *Assessment Update* should email <u>mde.testing@state.mn.us</u> to be added to the distribution list. Previous updates are posted to the <u>Assessment Update</u> page on PearsonAccess Next.

MDE includes key technology updates and articles in the *Assessment Update*, so it is important that DTC contact information is accurate. Technology coordinators should pay particular attention to the *Tech Update* section.

Note: The *Assessment Update* is no longer automatically sent to superintendents or directors but they can email <u>mde.testing@state.mn.us</u> to be added to the distribution list.

PearsonAccess Next Accounts

Pearson receives DAC and Alternate DAC contact information from MDE-ORG and uses this information to create DAC accounts in PearsonAccess Next within 1–2 business days of receiving this information.

If your DAC account was created or updated in MDE-ORG more than three days ago and you did not receive an automatically generated email from PearsonAccess Next System Message with instructions for logging in to your account, contact Pearson at 888-817-8659 or <u>submit a Pearson help desk request</u>.

Note: While the Training Management System (TMS) is not directly linked to PearsonAccess Next, having a DAC user role provides access to the "Admin" option in the TMS, which includes the ability to view completed trainings and document group trainings for all users in the district or school. From January to March, PearsonAccess Next account information for DACs is added to the TMS every week. For the rest of year, DAC PearsonAccess Next account information is added to the TMS every two weeks.

WIDA and WIDA AMS Accounts

In order to complete the required trainings for the ACCESS, Alternate ACCESS, and the WIDA Online Screener, DACs need to have a user account in the WIDA Secure Portal. Also, in order to complete administrative tasks for online testing or the online screener, DACs must have a user account in WIDA AMS. New DACs that need WIDA Secure Portal and WIDA AMS accounts should send their request to mde.testing@state.mn.us. As long as they are indicated as the DAC in MDE-ORG, MDE will approve the request and send it to the service providers to create both accounts.

Note: A new DAC should confirm they have already been indicated as the DAC in MDE-ORG before sending their request to <u>mde.testing@state.mn.us</u>.

On Friday, Oct. 16, MDE will send a site file to WIDA AMS with all the current information indicated in MDE-ORG. Within the next couple of weeks, District Testing Coordinators (DACs) and District Technology Coordinators will receive a notification email that WIDA AMS accounts have been updated for the current school year. Users will then be able to verify that the 2020–2021 Administration is available in the WIDA AMS Administration dropdown menu. <u>WriteToLearn</u> (under Quick Links on <u>PearsonAccess Next</u>) is a complimentary online literacy tool available for Minnesota teachers and students in grades 8 and 10. WriteToLearn provides students the opportunity to practice their essay and summary writing skills and expand their vocabulary. As students participate in assigned activities, they receive personalized feedback, hints, and tips to encourage, instruct, and reward their progress, and teachers have the benefit of assigning more writing practice without the added grading. 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Upcoming Opportunities

Virtual New DAC Orientation: Registration

MDE and Pearson will provide a virtual New DAC Orientation. In the past, this orientation was provided as an inperson, full-day session. For this year, in order to provide the best training experience for participants, the New DAC Orientation will be a virtual event spread across three days for a few hours each day, and each session will cover different topics. MDE recommends that DACs attend the live sessions, if possible, as they will include interactive information sharing as well as time to discuss topics with colleagues. However, the presentation will be recorded for each day's sessions if participants are unable to attend the sessions live. **Note: DACs should sign up for all three sessions, as each session will provide different information.**

MDE will provide an overview of the various roles and responsibilities of a DAC, the Minnesota Assessments, relevant MDE and WIDA systems, available resources, and training opportunities. Pearson will provide information on PearsonAccess Next, TestNav, reporting resources, and the Training Management System. Though designed as an introduction for new DACs in their first or second year, other relatively new DACs are also welcome to attend.

To prepare for the orientation, new DACs are encouraged to review the following New DAC training modules: *Understanding Training Requirements, Scheduling Testing*, and *Testing Policies and Procedures*. These modules are now available in the <u>Training Management System (TMS)</u> under the District Assessment Coordinator tab, New DAC Modules category. The *Minnesota Assessments Overview* module in this category is optional as the orientation will address much of the content in this module. Note: If you are a brand new DAC, you will use your district email to access TMS and select your district. Note: This training will not provide information that may be specific to any changes for spring 2021 test administrations; it will provide information on what happens in a typical school year.
