2020 Extended ACCESS Testing Window Participation

The extended spring 2020 testing window for ACCESS is being provided as an option **only** for English learners (ELs) who would have been eligible to exit a Language Instruction Educational Program (LIEP) based on previous scores and/or their other completed domain scores this past spring – **not** all ELs who were unable to complete testing last spring. The decision to participate in this extended testing window is determined by the district. 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College Entrance Exam Reimbursement Requests

Requests for reimbursement for eligible students who took a college entrance exam (ACT or SAT) by June 30, 2020, should be entered in the <u>Graduation Requirements Records (GRR) system</u> no later than Sept. 11.

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PearsonAccess Next Reporting

Due to the low number of MCA and MTAS tests completed, there is no summary data at the school, district, or state level available for 2020, which affects report availability in PearsonAccess Next. Refer to the 2020 Statewide Assessment Reporting Guidance Due to COVID-19 for answers to common questions about 2020 reporting; this guidance is located on the COVID-19 Updates web page under "Guidance for Districts and Schools."

Published Reports

Individual Student Reports (ISRs) with final assessment results for the 2020 MCA and MTAS test administrations will be provided only for students who had at least one valid score in at least one of the subjects tested; an ISR will not be provided if students did not receive a valid score in any subject. ISRs will be posted in Published Reports in PearsonAccess Next on Aug. 20 in the following groupings:

- ISRs by grade and subject posted by school
- **New for 2019–20**: Individual Student Reports (ISRs) Separated by Student: A zipped file of individual student reports separated by student posted by district and school.

Note: Minnesota percentile rank, growth, and average scores are not available on the 2020 ISRs.

The following reports for 2020 are unavailable in Published Reports:

Note: Access to the Combined On-Demand Report will be removed on Aug. 20 when final results are available in PearsonAccess Next.

Longitudinal Reports/Exports and Historical Student Data

Longitudinal Reports are not available as no summary data at the school, district, or state level are available for 2020. However, Longitudinal Exports will be available starting Aug. 20, as individual student results are available for 2020. Historical Student Data will also be available starting Aug. 20, but the data is very limited.

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New Report Focusing on American Indian Students

MDE is excited to announce that there will be a new report focusing solely on state-identified American Indian students released this August. This report will be located under "Assessment and Accountability" within Data Reports and Analytics on the MDE Data Center. This report will contain five individual download files including:

- Attendance
- Graduation
- Student Characteristics
- Standards-Based Assessments
- Standards-Based Assessments Non-Tested Students

This report represents American Indian students, as identified by the state definition, some of whom have not traditionally been included under the federal definition "American Indian or Alaska Native." MDE will also be releasing a user guide to assist in interpretation and use of the information contained within this new report.

Chrome, iOS, and Windows Store apps (Windows 10 only) will auto update unless the auto-update feature is disabled. If TestNav was not previously installed, find instructions for your OS on the Set up and Use TestNav page.
